



3. Cleaning

Unplug the TV from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid, abrasive, or aerosol cleaners. Cleaners can permanently damage the cabinet and screen. Use a lightly dampened cloth for cleaning.

4. Wall Mount Bracket

Wall mount bracket is only available for some models. If wall mount bracket is not supplied with this product, you can buy it at the local market.

Please refer to the Installing the Wall Mount Bracket page for dimensions.

5. Water and Moisture

Avoid dripping or splashing of liquids onto the product. Objects filled with liquids, such as vases, should not be placed on the product.

6. Setting

Do not place this TV on an unstable cart, stand or table. Placing the TV on an unstable base can cause the TV to fall, resulting in serious personal injuries as well as damage to the TV. Use only a cart, stand, bracket or table recommended by the manufacturer or salesperson.

7. Ventilation

Slots and openings in the cabinet are provided for ventilation, to ensure reliable operation of the TV and to protect it from overheating. Do not cover the ventilation openings in the cabinet and never place the set in a confined space such as built-in cabinet unless proper ventilation is provided. Leave a minimum 10cm gap all around the unit, the rear of the TV should be 6cm away from the wall.

8. Power Source

This TV should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supplied to your home, consult your appliance dealer or local power company.

9. Power-Cord Protection

Power- supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords at plug, wall outlets, and the point where they exit from the TV. MAIN plug on the power cord is used as the disconnect device, the disconnect device and socket-outlet shall be easily accessible.

10. Lightning

For added protection for this TV during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the TV due to lightning or powerline surge.

11. Power Lines




- Be sure to disconnect the AC power cord before removing a base stand or installing wall mount brackets.
- The display on your TV is fragile. Make sure the TV screen is not scratched or damaged by hard objects or from pressure.
- After the installation is complete, make sure the TV is steady on a table or firmly attached to a wall mount, before removing all protective film, if any.

Installing the Stand

Follow the illustrations and instructions below to complete the installation steps:

For 65"

1. Carefully place your TV face-down on a soft, flat surface to prevent damage to the TV or scratching to the screen.




5. Hook Part B to Part a1 as the illustration shows. Please note that the side with 4 pads should placed outward.

 Then, secure Part B with 6 screws (M5×16).


 Next, secure Part B with 2 screws (ST4×12).

8. You can tidy the cables into slots of Part a1.



9. Place Part a2 onto Part a1.




10. Slightly push the centre of the Part a2, then slightly pinch the both sides.




11. Now, you can place the TV on a surface, and tear off all protective film on TV.

For 75"

- 1. Take out the Upper cushions a1 and a2 together with the side cushions b1 and b2.
 2. Place upper cushion a1 and side cushion b1 as the illustration shows, and put Base Stand Part A and B in them to prepare for the Base Stand installation of Base Stand.
- 3. Make the bulge part of Part B, as the picture shows below, align to the corresponding place of Part A.




4. Use your hand to hold the Base Stand Part A and B together. Then use 7 screws (M5×16) to assemble Base Stand Part A and B.








5. Place all the 4 upper and side cushions into the box as the illustration shows.




- Two people stand on each side of the television. Hold the side of TV with one hand and hold the bottom of TV with the other hand as the illustration shows. Then lift the TV up carefully.
- 7. Two people place the TV on the assembled box with the screen face down. Make sure the surface of the assembled box is clean and smooth.
- Align the part in the circle to the TV as the picture shows.







 Use four screws(M5×16) to secure the assembled Base Stand to the TV tightly.



10. Now, the installation is finished. You can place the TV on a flat surface, and tear off all protective film on TV.

Installing the Wall Mount Bracket

Before mounting the TV, remove the TV stand if you have already attached it, and make sure the wall mount bracket supports the weight of your TV.

() CAUTION

When mounting the TV on a wall, follow instructions provided with the wall mount bracket. If it is not correctly mounted, the TV may fall and cause property damage or personal injury.

- Place spacers between the TV and bracket.

Making Connections

▶ **HEADPHONE** Connect Headphone for audio out of the TV.



ATTENTION


Excessive sound pressure from earphones and headphones can cause hearing loss.

► NOTE

Please make sure that the headphone you plug in is without microphone function, or it may not be supported.

DIGITAL AUDIO OUT Connect to an external digital audio system.

Before connecting a digital audio system to the DIGITAL AUDIO OUT jack, you should decrease the volume of both the TV and the system to avoid that the volume suddenly becomes bigger.



• eARC Connect an HDMI cable from an external digital audio system.

eARC enables the TV to directly output the digital sound through an HDMI cable. Please note that it works only when the TV is connected to the audio receiver that supports the eARC (Audio Return Channel) function.

When this port is used as the eARC function, it can't be used as signal input at the same time.



USB

Connect the USB1.1 and USB2.0 devices such as hard drives, USB sticks and digital cameras for browsing photos, listening to music and watching movies.



DI NOTES

- When connecting a hard disk or a USB hub, always connect the mains adapter of the connected device to the power supply. If a USB 1.1 or USB2.0 device requires more than 500mA or 5V, the USB device may not be supported. Max supported current for USB 3.0 device is 1A (only for some models). Exceeding the max supported current may result in damage or data loss.
- · Certain digital cameras may not be compatible with the TV.



 insert the CI card into the CI+ module in accordance with the Service Provider's
 instructions.
- Do not repeatedly insert or remove the Common Access Module as this may damage the interface and cause a malfunction.
- You must obtain a CI+ module and card from the service provider of the channels you want to watch.
- Insert the CI+ module with the SmartCard in the direction marked on the module and SmartCard.
- CI+ is not supported in some countries and regions; check with your authorized dealer.

LAN (Wired setup)

Connect your TV to your network by connecting the LAN port on the back of your TV to an external modem or router using a LAN (Ethernet/Cat 5) cable. See the illustration below.

 We recommend you to use a modem or router that supports Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol (DHCP). Modems and routers that support DHCP automatically provide the IP address, subnet mask, gateway, and DNS, so you don't have to enter them manually. Most home networks already have DHCP.



Wireless setup


Connect your TV to your wireless network, you need a wireless router or modem. See the illustration below.

The TV's built-in Wireless LAN Adapter supports the IEEE 802.11 a/b/g/n/ac/ax communication protocols.





- You must use the built-in Wireless LAN Adapter to use a wireless network because the set doesn't support external USB network adapter.
- If the wireless router supports DHCP, your TV can connect more easily to the wireless network.
- If you apply a security system which is not listed below, it will not work with the TV.
 Security system : WPA, WEP, WPA2.
- In order to guarantee smooth network, the distance between router and TV should be less than 10 meters.





Installing Batteries in the Remote Control

- 1. Slide the back cover to open the battery compartment of the remote control.
- Insert two AA or AAA size batteries. Make sure to match the (+) and (-) ends of the batteries with the (+) and (-) ends indicated in the battery compartment.
- 3. Close the battery compartment with the cover.
- 1. Press the switch and the battery case will pop up automatically.
- 2. Insert two AA or AAA size batteries. Make sure to match the (+) and (-) ends of the batteries with the (+) and (-) ends indicated in the battery compartment.
- 3. Push the battery case back to the remote control.

NOTES

Pairing the Remote Control (only for Bluetooth remote control)


Pair the remote to the TV after you power it on. Keep the remote control within 3 metres from the TV. Press any button (except power and mic button) to pair.

NOTES

- If an unknown error occurred with the remote, then it could have been caused by interference. Try to remove what's causing the interference and pair it again.
- If an unknown error occurred in the remote control while the battery power is normal, you can take out the batteries, press any key for 1~2 seconds, and insert them back. Then the remote control will work normally.
- · The remote cannot be paired to the TV while the TV is in standby mode.

Remote Control Operation Range

- 1. The remote control can work at a distance of up to 8 meters in front of the TV set.
- The remote control angle: taking the remote sensor as an apex, 6 meters away, its controlled horizontal angle is within ±30°, while the vertical angle is within ±15°.
- 3. The operating distance may vary depending on the brightness of the room.
